

### Derogation Number DER-BAT-2025-96

# EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES (BIRDS AND NATURAL HABITATS) REGULATIONS, 2011 (S.I. No 477 of 2011)

#### **DEROGATION**

Granted under Regulation 54 of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011, hereinafter referred to as "the Habitats Regulations".

The Minister for Housing, Local Government & Heritage, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by Regulation 54 of the Habitats Regulations hereby grants to **Maria Commane** of **Newhall House, Drummeen, Ennis, County Clare, V95 X448** a derogation. It is stated that this derogation is issued:

- A. In the interests of public health and public safety, or for other imperative reasons of overriding public interest, including those of a social or economic nature and beneficial consequences of primary importance for the environment
- B. As there is no satisfactory alternative, and the action authorised by this derogation will not be detrimental to the maintenance of the population of <u>bats</u> referred to below at a favourable conservation status in their natural range.

This derogation authorises the following:

- 1. Roost disturbance
- 2. Actions authorised within the derogation

The derogation is issued in respect of the following **bat species**:

Lesser Horseshoe Bat
Brown Long-Eared Bat
Natterer's Bat
Common Pipistrelle
Soprano Pipistrelle
Rhinolophus Hipposideros
Plecotus Auritus
Myotis Nattereri
Pipistrellus Pipistrellus
Pipistrellus Pygmaeus



#### **Terms and Conditions**

- This derogation is granted solely to allow the activities specified in connection with the works located at Former Farm Buildings associated with Newhall House, County Clare, for Maria Commane.
- 2. All activities authorised by this derogation, and all equipment used in connection herewith, shall be carried out, constructed and maintained (as the case may be) so as to avoid unnecessary injury or distress to any species of **BAT**. Anything done other than in accordance with the terms of this derogation may constitute an offence
- 3. This derogation may be modified or revoked, for stated reasons, at any time.
- 4. The mitigation measures outlined in the application report (Derogation Licence Application and Bat Survey Report Newhall Estate Stables Redevelopment, County Clare), together with any changes or clarification agreed in correspondence between NPWS and the agent or applicant, are to be carried out. Strict adherence must be paid to all the proposed measures in the application.
- 5. The actions which this derogation authorise shall be completed between **7**<sup>th</sup> **February-31**<sup>st</sup> **December 2025, inclusive.**
- 6. The works will be supervised by bat ecologist: Tom O'Donnell.
- 7. Screening is required within the walled garden between the construction area and the nearby alternative roost, to negate potential disturbance to the alternative roost. The ecologist must advise and ensure it is suitable and fit for purpose.
- 8. The porthole entrance to the attic of the storeroom should be maintained to allow access to all bat species.
- 9. The bat entrance in the gate lodge must be enlarged, in consultation with Regional NPWS staff. This is to be carried out as soon as possible, when there are no bats in the building.
- 10. The roof felt in the gate lodge must be monitored into the future and repair works carried out where required, if there is a threat of entanglement.
- 11. If this derogation addresses works that are subject of a planning application, no such works permitted under this derogation can occur until planning permission is granted.
- 12. If this derogation expires prior to works permitted under this derogation commencing, a new application must be sought in advance, including the provision of any updated data or reports.
- 13. This derogation shall be produced for inspection on a request being made on that behalf by a member of An Garda Síochána or an authorised NPWS officer appointed under Regulation 4 of the Habitats Regulations.
- 14. The local **NPWS District Conservation Officer**, <a href="mailto:davida.lyons@npws.gov.ie">davida.lyons@npws.gov.ie</a>, must be contacted prior to the commencement of any activity and if bats are detected on site prior to demolition or during the course of the work, under the terms of this derogation.
- 15. On completion of the actions which this derogation authorises, all recordings of bat species affected will be made using the standardised data form provided below and must be submitted to the NPWS within four weeks of the expiry date of this licence. Included with the below returns form, a report will also be submitted to <a href="wildlife.reports@npws.gov.ie">wildlife.reports@npws.gov.ie</a> detailing results of works and success of mitigation. Both documents must be submitted to constitute a derogation return.
